

Summer Reading Assignments for Upcoming 3rd Graders

(2 assignments-Due August 7)

- 1. Select a chapter book and complete the "Book in a Bag" project. See directions below.
- 2. Read *The Littles* by John Peterson. The students will be assessed on this book the first full day that they return to school, which will be Wednesday, August 7.

Book in a Bag Project- Due Wednesday, August 7

Students will select a chapter book of their choosing. They may not have chosen this book for a previous report, and the book must be on a 2.8 grade level or higher. (If you are not sure of the books reading level, you may check it at www.arbookfind.com.) After reading the chapter book, students should decorate a bag. Along with decorations, the bag should include the title of the book, the author, the main characters, and the setting. Then, students should place 5 items in the bag that relate to the story. For each item, students should make an index card that explains how the item relates to the story. Finally, students should use one more index card to write 3 things that they have in common with the main character. Students should practice presenting their projects at home ahead of time. I have included the rubric that I will use to grade the projects.
